ABOUT ALLIN

ALLin is a youth exchange project, which is aiming to build bridges between young people, thus united they can fight against hate speech for the sake of an inclusive society.

Today's society is facing increased challenges. Dangerous political trends, based on the narrative of „us” versus „them”, are spreading and contributing to a close-minded society. Diversity and tolerance are becoming curse words. Various platforms are appearing where certain political parties, organizations and individuals are promoting this „exclusive” society with using hate speech.

In times of spreading hateful discourses and the decreasing importance of acceptance and solidarity in the society, promoting and disseminating values of respect for human dignity, democracy, equality, freedom, human rights and the rule of law, is extremely important. For this reason, the project aims to provide four young people from the participating countries (plus one group leader) with the opportunity to learn about hate speech and exclusive discourses in order to recognize and promote the importance of an inclusive society and fight against hate speech.

MAIN OBJECTIVES

- **to understand the importance of Human Rights and diversity in our societies**
- **to provide opportunity for young people to experience intercultural learning**
- **to understand our role in the creation of social inclusion by respecting values as tolerance, equity, freedom and diversity**
- **to initiate a campaign in our local reality aiming to promote inclusive society and critical response to online/offline hate speech**

THE ORGANIZER

Tudatos Ifjúságért Alapítvány (TIA) was established in 2015 as a voluntary organization in Hungary. It has many active members working with young people on different topics, such as human rights education, active participation, citizenship, learning by playing and doing. The organization aims to develop the key competencies (particularly the social and civic competences) of young people, which are important in the modern world in order to actively affect positive change in our society. It believes that these knowledge, skills and attitudes are the basis for the support of integration of individuals into the community, active participation in public affairs and community development.

PARTICIPATING COUNTRIES

- The youth exchange will involve 30 participants. 4 young people + 1 group leader from the following countries: Hungary (hosting country), Armenia, Lebanon, Morocco, Spain and Turkey. The language of the exchange will be

PROFILE OF THE PARTICIPANTS

The youth exchange aims to build bridges between young people, thus we aim to reach participants between 18 and 24 years old. Participation from diverse social, cultural, religious and economic background are encouraged. The profile of the participants are expected to be based upon a strong commitment towards due to the strong commitment towards the aims and objectives of the youth exchange, the ability to contribute to the delegated group's work during the youth exchange.

Participants with fewer opportunities will be provided priority during the selection process, such as young people from low socio-economic status and/or belonging to minority groups..

VENUE AND DATE

The youth exchange will take place between 26th August and 2nd September, 2018 at Pilismarót, Hungary. Please note that Pilismarót is a very small town, thus the access to services will be limited.

TRAVEL COSTS

Visa costs will be fully reimbursed.

Travel costs will be reimbursed according to the following:

- **Spain, and Turkey: 275 euros**
- **Armenia, Morocco and Lebanon: 360 euro**
- **Hungary: upon agreement with the organizers**
